Phones and Watches...a Pain in the Neck

Smartphone Sales Decline

Samsung Electronics latest devices feature different names, new camera tricks and add a nostalgic way to open the phone. The South Korean technology giant is still stumbling around with the question of what more to offer the consumer who believe they already have enough. “At a San Francisco event on Tuesday, Samsung, the world’s largest smartphone maker, presented its ideas: three models of its mainstream Galaxy S phones—dubbed the S20, a generous numeric upgrade from last year’s Galaxy S10 moniker—and a new foldable screen.”

The device is called Galaxy Z Flip. It opens vertically and is all screen on the inside. The S20 models are compatible with 5G, the next-generation network slowly rolling out worldwide; however, the Galaxy Z Flip is not. The three Galaxy S20 screen sizes vary from 6.2 inches, 6.7 inches, and 6.9 inches. Prices range from \$1,000 to \$1,400. The Galaxy Z Flip will cost \$1,380. The ardent tech enthusiast now averages replacing their phones to nearly three years according to a Strategy Analytics survey.

The new foldable phone accelerated the company’s smartphone earnings. The phone’s physical design has been the “cool factor” in the past. The Z Flip clamshell design has a small display window on the outside and includes an external camera. The “Z” in its name indicates its folding design and alludes to future origami-like designs that could possibly follow. ■

Apple Watches

Apple's weren't the first smart watches, but they have perfected the technology when they launched the Apple Watch. Apple Watches can do all the typical things other smart watches do – alert you when you get a text message or email, track your daily fitness goals, can act as a remote control for music apps- but they can also integrate into Apple's iOS ecosystem of complimentary devices. They are designed to get more out of your Apple products. For example, every Apple Watch can make your iPhone emit a tone in case it gets lost and it can also answer phone calls received on the iPhone. You can even consult with Siri, Apple's personal assistant app. An Apple Watch can make shopping easier by using the Apple Pay. Many retailers accept this as payment which allows you not have to carry your credit cards. You can use the watch to act as a remote for your TV. Depending on the year and make of your car, you can open and lock your car, locate your car in a parking garage, start the engine, or check an electric car's battery level. Prices range from \$249-\$1,399.

Apple Watches are only compatible with iPhones. Only certain iPhones work with the watch. You must have a iPhone5 or later that's running iOS 8.2 or later. After an overnight charge, the Apple Watch can have up to 18 hours of charge. ■

Injuries Caused by Cellphones

JAMA Otolaryngology-Head & Neck Surgery examined data from emergency departments from January 1998 to December 2017. Twenty years of data reveal a spike in cellphone-related injuries to the head, neck, and eyes. Although the injuries are relatively minor (cuts and bruises) some were more severe fractures and internal injuries with long-term complications. Many injuries were a result from distraction, such as driving or walking while using a phone, but others were caused by hitting someone's face or a battery exploding. The study results spiked in 2007 when the Smartphone hit the market.

One hundred hospitals that recorded data on over 2,500 patients during the study, estimate the national total to be over 76,000 injuries. The largest percentage of injuries occurred in the home. Those in the age group between 13 to 29 were most at risk for injury while driving, walking, or texting. The study also revealed injuries while using augmented-reality based video games, such as Pokémon Go. Although you may love your phone, you wouldn't walk around reading a magazine. ■
